Washington University to study Marketing.

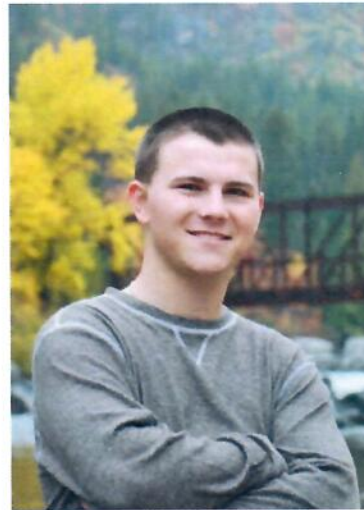


Faina Lorah is
